TAKING YOUR RESEARCH FURTHER

- The individual research pages on <u>Family Search</u> are excellent for when you are just beginning to research a French emigrant. (In English)
- The websites of the various **Departmental Archives**, especially those of Haut-Rhin and Bas-Rhin, have very good essays on researching emigrants

from their regions. (In French) (Links to them all are in the left-hand column of <u>The French Genealogy Blog</u>)

- The website of the <u>Archives nationales</u> has a number of superb articles introducing archival series that relate to emigration and explaining how to research. (In French)
- <u>Geneawiki, l'encyclopédie de la généalogie</u> is a superb source of information on archives and genealogical research for all of France. (In French)
- <u>FranceGenWeb</u> is a bit more in the style of the early days of the Internet and is awkward to use, but has quite a lot of informations.
- Consider joining and reading the publications of a specific French genealogy group or association and/or a relevant local history association. The articles published by members are often very helpful. A list of all such associations in France can be found on the website of the <u>Fédération Française</u> <u>de Généalogie</u>.
