## INTRODUCTION

We are currently in the midst of celebrating the bicentennial of the War of 1812 – sometimes referred to as the “Forgotten War.” A host of records still exist for this time period and are scattered throughout national, state, and local archives. So voluminous are some of these record collections that until now, efforts to digitize them and make them available online have been low priority. Users of libraries and archives throughout the country are often unaware of the depth and breadth of the content of these records.

## FEDERAL RECORDS

Records held at the Federal level are held in a number of Record Groups (RG). The most valuable of the set are the Pension and Bounty Land files (RG 15) comprising the applications of over 180,000 soldiers currently held at the National Archives in Washington, D.C. (NARA). Over the years, numerous indexes, finding aids, and research helps have been created to research the records of the War of 1812.

### **1. VOLUNTEER ARMY, COMPILED MILITARY SERVICE RECORDS (CSMR)**
