#### LAW IN THE TIME AND THE PLACE

Standards 12, 14, 24

Genealogists evaluate information within the context of time and place of the historical event. It is important to avoid *presentism*, or applying the laws and standards of today to the interpretation of the past.<sup>3</sup> To understand the information contained in a source, researchers analyze the facts against the backdrop of the source's creation in the specific location. The law may help researchers to understand actions and potential motivations.

## **RESOLVE CONFLICTS!**

## Standards 48,49

One component of the Genealogical Proof Standard requires the researcher to resolve conflicts before a proven conclusion can be reached. If a genealogist is still undecided after reviewing evidence, then the conclusion is likely a hypothesis or theory and not yet proven.<sup>4</sup> The key may lie in resolving the conflict!

When looking for sources to provide information about circumstances surrounding these events, be sure to evaluate the contemporaneous establishments, institutions, and organizations that would have been likely to create some of the following records:

- Death certificates
- Medical examiner and coroner records
- ❖ Historical and modern criminal court records
- Historical and modern civil court records
- Newspapers
- Manuscript collections
- Records of temporary homes and orphanages
- Records of detention facilities



*International List of Causes of Death (ICD codes)* 

What about the handwritten numbers on some death certificates? These codes are part of an international system to monitor causes of injury and death, which has evolved and become more detailed over time. Be sure to use the code that was current at the time the death certificate was created.

According to ICD-3, which was the current classification system in 1922, the cause of death for code 146 was puerperal sepsis.<sup>5</sup>

(Note that the contributory condition was malaria, which became endemic in the Tennessee River Valley during this period in history.<sup>6</sup> Details like this may enhance the research.)

#### TIMELINES & TABLES

Timelines and tables can help genealogists to visualize information. Arranging information in various ways can show gaps and reveal patterns.

There are some commonly-used software platforms for constructing timelines and tables:

It's usually worthwhile to make an informal chronological timeline to see how events fit together, especially when the timing is tight.

#### **CONCEPTION CALCULATORS**

These online tools appear to be designed for modern pregnancies but they're incredibly useful for genealogists! The average gestation of a human baby is forty weeks, or thirty-eight weeks from conception.<sup>7</sup> Knowing a birthdate, it is possible to calculate a window of conception for typical length pregnancies.

Researchers may interchange *due date* with a known birthdate and the calculator will provide a window of conception for that day, although some calculators do allow the input of birth date.
