FamilyTreeDNA Tree Integration with MyHeritage

Syllabus

FamilyTreeDNA customers need to consider several factors when deciding whether to transfer their tree from FamilyTreeDNA or link to an existing MyHeritage tree. I've created a decision-making aid in the form of a chart.

In bulleted form:

If you transfer an existing tree and link to that tree at MyHeritage:

- Your linked matches at FamilyTreeDNA remain linked. You need to confirm each one, but you're prompted and it's easy.
- To link new matches at FamilyTreeDNA, you'll need to add them to your transferred tree at MyHeritage if they don't already exist.
- Unlimited expansion of tree for 90 days if you don't have a MyHeritage subscription. If you have a subscription already, there are no tree size restrictions.
- Tree data is sent periodically to FamilyTreeDNA for research purposes to improve their features such as MyOrigins and relationship calculations. You can opt-out if you wish.

If you link to an existing MyHeritage tree:

- You need to select home person.
- You need to relink your matches at FamilyTreeDNA.
- To link new matches at FamilyTreeDNA, you'll need to add them to the MyHeritage tree if they don't already exist.
- You need a subscription if your tree is more than 250 people. If you have a subscription, there are no tree size restrictions.
- No tree data is sent to FamilyTreeDNA and, unfortunately, you cannot opt-in.

If you don't have a tree at either vendor and create a new tree at MyHeritage:

- You need to create a free account and tree through FamilyTreeDNA to receive the free 90-day ability to build a tree of unlimited size.
- Unlimited expansion of tree for 90 days. After that time, you will need a subscription to continue to add to your tree. There is no tree size restriction with a MyHeritage subscription.
- You need to link yourself to the home person in this tree.
- You can and should link your matches to their profile card in this tree.
- To link matches at FamilyTreeDNA, you'll need to add that person to your tree at MyHeritage.
- If you opt-in, tree data is sent periodically to FamilyTreeDNA for research purposes to improve their features such as MyOrigins and relationship calculations.
