Not only do they automatically find historical records for people in your family tree, but they can also serve as a kind of roadmap for your research. 
Record Matches

- Record Matching intelligently compares the ca. 5 billion family tree profiles on MyHeritage to more than 21 billion historical records* on the MyHeritage historical records search engine and automatically finds matches for you.
- If you have Record Matches, you will see a notification appear on the sidebar of the homepage in your family site alerting you that you have matches.
- Click on the notification to enter the results page or click on the 'Discoveries' tab.
- The Record Matches feature runs for free for everyone who has one or more family trees on MyHeritage.
- Viewing the matches is free, but viewing full records and their scanned images or newspaper articles requires a Data Subscription.

Record Matches eliminate the need to actively search for records mentioning the individuals in a family tree (saves time).

View your tree and click the brown Record Match icon on a person's profile card and then view the records the algorithm has found automatically.



Use caution when looking at the matches. Historical records are not always 100% accurate. Keep in mind:

- The record itself may contain errors.
- Record Match is incorrect (may present a record of a person with the same name who was born or died in the same place).
- Always read and review these records just to make sure they point to the right person.
